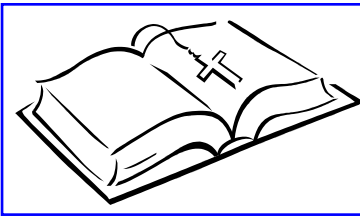

In the United Methodist Church, that is the time Annual Conferences hold their yearly Conferences. This year the Desert Southwest Conference will hold their 25th Session of Annual Conference at a new site. It will never be held at a venue closer to us than where it is being held this year. Beginning on Thursday, June 25th the Renaissance Glendale Hotel and Spa will be headquarters for our Annual Conference. Lakeview will be represented by Dottie Neil, Carol Armstrong and Jean Callahan. First UMC will be represented by Harlan Kloostra and Lyle De Rose, and Youngtown will have Margaret Chittenden representing them as Lay Delegates. Opal Hantke will serve as Youngtown's alternate delegate. Ross Parrott, Gary Roper and Louie Lyon are the clergy representing the Greater Parish. The Lay and Clergy Delegates are the ones authorized to vote on your behalf on the issues brought before the Annual Conference.

This year it will be an interesting conference because 32 Constitutional Amendments will be brought before the conference and voted on. These Constitutional Amendments were approved at the last General Conference and need to be voted on by each Annual Conference in order to change the United Methodist Constitution as printed in our Book of Discipline. I invite you to come to various sessions (you will see elsewhere in the Lakeviewer a schedule highlighting key events that I recommend for you to view or see), especially the Service of Ordination which is a most elegant and meaningful service.

It is hard for me to believe that as June concludes it marks one full year that Joyce and I have been amongst you. We are looking forward to the bishop calling out the names of each of the pastors in the Greater Parish on Sunday of Annual Conference. The Setting of Appointments is done at the conclusion of Annual Conference. This is when it is made official where each pastor will serve during the next year beginning July 1st. Joyce and Louie look forward to a wonderful year amongst you in the Greater Parish.

Summer time is a time of travel, and I hope that as you travel you will stop and worship at a nearby church. God doesn't leave us, and I hope that we will remember that He is waiting for us to drop on in at one of His houses of worship somewhere. If you are staying in Sun City or Youngtown during the summer, we hope you'll continue to worship with us as we offer worship at the regular worship hours.

I want to conclude my pastor's article this month by thanking both Noni Porter and Don Bommarito for all the work and love that they shared through the years with Lakeview United Methodist Church and the churches of the Greater Parish once the Greater Parish came into existence. Both these fine servants of God will be missed by the members and friends of our three churches, and the staff will miss their presence amongst us. ### **OBERAMMERGAU PASSION PLAY**

The Lyons are going to the Passion Play in 2010 and invite you to join them. Several months ago, this article appeared in *The Lakeviewer* and Joyce and Louie are reprinting it again if there might be any others from the Greater Parish who might have a thought about making this journey with us. We would be happy to answer any questions you might have about the trip. Just give Louie a call at 974-5821, Ext. 117.

Join Joyce and Louie for a trip of a lifetime as we attend the Oberammergau Passion Play in 2010. This is a nine-day European adventure departing Phoenix on August 31st. The Passion Play is presented once every ten years, and 2010 is the next scheduled year. The trip includes visits to Munich, Germany; Innsbruck and Salzburg, Austria. We also will travel through the Brenner Pass in Italy and see many different castles in the area. At the conclusion of the Oberammergau trip (day 9), Joyce and Louie will begin an Italy extension trip visiting northern Italy stopping in Venice, Florence, and seeing Siena and Pisa and the Basilica of Assisi. This trip also includes ancient Rome, where you will see the Colosseum, the Catacombs, Vatican and Sistine Chapel.

The cost of the 9-day trip or basic trip is \$3,196 from Phoenix or Tucson. If you were to take the 7-day extension trip to Italy, it would cost an additional \$1,798. The trip that the Lyons are hosting is with Educational Opportunities. The Lyons have traveled with them many times previously and highly recommend this tour company. If you might have an interest in traveling with the Lyons or have any questions, just ask Joyce or Louie for a brochure to see the itinerary first hand. The base price includes round trip airfare, deluxe motor coaches, accommodations, guided sightseeing, entrance fees, daily European breakfasts, and a full dinner daily. There is an added \$298 cost for a ticket to the Passion Play, and Louie adds that the Passion Play is what makes this trip worthwhile. After attending in 2000 the Lyons have never looked at Good Friday in the same way again.

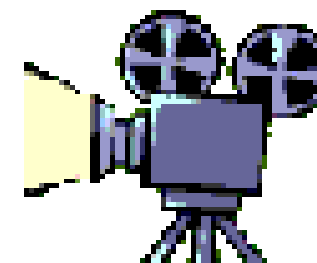

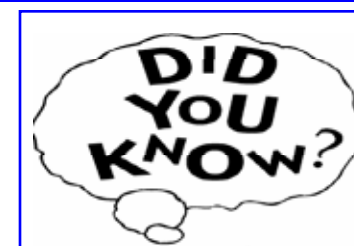

**NEW BOOKS**

*A Flickering Light* by Jane Kirkpatrick. “Jessie Ann Gaebele loves nothing more than capturing a gorgeous Minnesota landscape when the sunlight casts its most mesmerizing shadows. So when F.J. Bauer hires her in 1907 to assist in his studio and darkroom, her dreams for a career in photography appear to find root in reality. With the infamous hazards of the explosive powder used for lighting and the toxic darkroom chemicals, photography is considered a man’s profession. Yet Jessie shows remarkable talent in both the artistry and business of running a studio. She proves less skillful, however, at managing her growing attraction to the very married Mr. Bauer. This luminous coming-of-age tale deftly exposes the intricate shadows that play across every dream worth pursuing—and the irresistible light that beckons the dreamer on.” (Quote from publisher) As with the author’s other historical novels, many of the characters are actual historical figures. **HABITAT HOUSE REPORT**

Saturday, May 9th, over 100 people joined in Surprise at the Johnstown Townhouse dedication. The five units were built in 48,000 person-hours over 23 weeks, which set a record for West Valley Habitat for Humanity (most such projects take a year or more to complete). Lakeview had 52 individual persons working on this project.

The Missions Committee will again support a Habitat for Humanity home build in 2010.
